



# Flood Warning Pembroke District

**NEWS** 04/28/2017

The Pembroke District of the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry is advising residents that a Flood Warning is still in effect for Renfrew County.

Residents should be aware that water levels are still high and are contributing to flooding around the County.

For safety, all residents should keep a close watch on conditions, regularly check for updated messages and exercise caution near fast-moving rivers and streams.

The Ministry also advises extreme caution when using forest access roads for outdoor activities as many are seasonally inundated with water, prone to washouts and may be impassible due to current water levels.

Any residents with flooding concerns should take appropriate action to protect their property. Anyone requiring sandbags or assistance should contact their local municipality.

#### **TECHNICAL INFORMATION**

### **Description of Current Conditions**

Water levels have peaked and are starting to recede however if significant rain falls as forecast, water levels may once again rise. Almost all of the snowpack has melted leaving most areas in Renfrew County snow-free.

### **Terminology: Notification Levels**

WATERSHED CONDITIONS STATEMENT - FLOOD OUTLOOK: gives early notice of the potential for flooding based on weather forecasts calling for heavy rain, snow melt, high winds or other conditions

WATERSHED CONDITIONS STATEMENT – WATER SAFETY: indicates that high flows, melting ice or other factors could be dangerous for such users as boaters, anglers and swimmers but flooding is not expected.

FLOOD WATCH: potential for flooding exists within specific watercourses and municipalities

FLOOD WARNING: flooding is imminent or occurring within specific watercourses and municipalities.
