5. Delegations and Presentations

5.1 Darrel O'Shaughnessy - Non-Profit Community Service Cooperative

Mr. O'Shaughnessy explained that the SALC and the Men's Shed have outgrown their current space. An opportunity has come up to purchase a building, however, this building requires studies to be completed before committing to purchase it. Mr. O'Shaughnessy is requesting that Council agree to split the \$35,000 fee to obtain a Hazardous Substance Report and to engage an Architect. The amount required from the Township for this request is \$7,000. If the reports deem this project feasible, the costs to purchase and renovate the building is estimated to be approximately \$1,350,000. Council expressed their concerns with investing in a capital expenditure not in our Township and also expressed concerns with committing to this investment without knowing the expectations to contribute to future costs. Mr. O'Shaughnessy confirmed that there would be no obligation to contribute anything further after this \$7,000.
